2025 MEDICAID FIGURES FOR NAMI ESTIMATION (Net Available Monthly Income)

Medicaid applications should be turned into the County of last residency.

- If in an Adult Care in a different county, they apply in that county.
- If in a licensed Assisted Living, they keep their original residency.
- If in a non-licensed Assisted Living, they change their residency to that county.

\$3,948.00 Minimum Monthly Maintenance Needs Allowance (MMMNA)
Institutionalized/community spouse total combined gross income
Do not include resident's SSI in the income

\$74,820.00 Community Spousal Resource Allowance (CSRA)
Determined based on total of institutionalized/non-institutionalized
resources based on date of admission to SV regardless of placement
(permanent or non-permanent)
DSS will determine allowance, as there is a range. This level is applicable to the
Community spouse only presuming the community spouse is not residing in
SV. (\$74,820.00 minimum and \$154,140.00 maximum)

\$31,584 Institutionalized Resident Resource Allowance (single or spousal)

\$1,097.00 Return Home Allowance (only for Individuals with no Spouse)

Single Residents with no plans to return home:

- **All income** minus \$50 and minus any Health Insurance payments comes here to SV.
- **Medicaid does not allow community bills to be paid with the Resident's income. No taxes, NYSEG, credit cards, or Life Insurance can be paid, or a penalty will incur at your expense.**
- Resident's SSI is **not** considered income as this amount will drop or be eliminated. **The Social Security Administration needs to be notified that the Resident is here so SSA can adjust the income.**
- SSD is considered income.
- VA pension with no Aid & Attendance is considered income.
- Reverse Mortgage – converts to Investment Funds and used in the Resource Allowance if done within the 5-year lookback.
- Land is considered a resource of fair market value.
- Medicaid allows 10 days a year for personal leave.

Residents with plans to return home:

- If they have community Medicaid and they are staying more than 30 days, they will need to complete a Chronic application so their case can be converted.
- If community Medicaid but staying less than 30 days DSS will have to be contacted to review coverage.
- If Managed Medicaid – they can stay that way for short stays and but once they are designated at long term, then they will have to convert to Chronic Medicaid.
- If < 29 days they cannot do another < 29 days for 12 months.

Seneca View Private Pay Rates

Dear Private Pay Resident or Responsible Party:

Effective February 6, 2025, the Nursing Facility's private pay rate for room and board rates for 2025 are as follows: Therapy charges are anticipated to increase 3% in 2025.

Daily Room Rate (and Bed Hold rate) including all services <u>except</u> those listed below	\$488 per day for a private room and \$474 per day for a semi-private room and board plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax
Restorative Treatment for Rehabilitation Therapy (Physical, Occupational and Speech)	\$45.00 per 15 minutes unit of service plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax
IV Therapy	Cost (*) for IV supplies plus 15% handling fee plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax
Pharmaceuticals	Cost (*) for drugs plus 15% pharmacist fee plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax
Oxygen Therapy	Cost (*) for oxygen plus 15% handling charge plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax
Wound-Vac Treatment	Cost (*) for wound-vac supplies/equipment plus 15% handling charge plus 6.8% NYS Assessment Tax

(*) Facility's cost without mark-up

Medicare requires nursing homes to issue an itemized monthly statement for the services listed above. If a resident covered by Medicare Part A during the first 100 days of stay, the only charges will be for the co-pay amounts. However, once Part A coverage has ended, residents are billed the private pay daily room rate, plus any charges for pharmacy and oxygen. Private pay residents who do not have Medicare Part B coverage will be responsible for restorative therapy treatments, if applicable.
